

MFC Chaoxiang Monogram Guidebook

The inspiration source for Chaoxiang Monogram is another hand-drawn treasure from a vintage embroidery publication which plays on the anglo-version of chinese letters with stabbing strokes and the charm of the orient. While the original intent of this monogram style is uncertain, the possibilities of its use are up to your imagination. This is one of many monogram designs from the early 1900's which fall into a two letter format bound within a framing element.

Chaoxiang Monogram Standard Styles

Chaoxiang Monogram is only capable of two letter monograms due to its unique design. For those with Opentype Ligatures enabled, Chaoxiang Monogram will automatically type the monogram correctly no matter what combination of Capitals and Lowercase you type.

To create a vintage inspired monogram, select MFC Chaoxiang Monogram from your font menu, and just type a Capital, then a lowercase letter.



Type A then m



Type K then o



Type P then m



Type Z then y

All of the non-alphabetic character slots contain a small chop frame, much like a bullet. This element can be used to add flair to a single monogram or act as a decorative element between the monograms of a couple. (see the examples below)



Type . then A then m then . then B then b then .
