



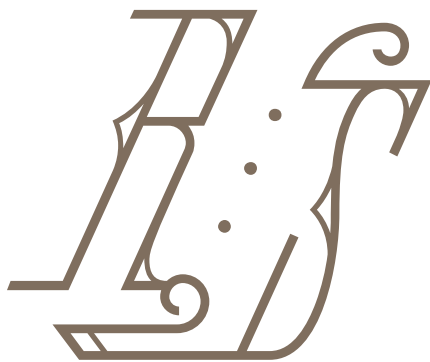
MFC Fantasie Monogram Guidebook

The inspiration source for Fantasie Monogram is another hand-drawn design from a vintage embroidery publication which relies on rigid geometric letterforms on a dynamic slant stepping downwards. This monogram, which evokes visions of it embossed or printed on antique cookie tins, was originally intended to adorn handkerchiefs, but the possibilities of its use are up to your imagination. This is one of many monogram designs from the early 1900's which fall into a two letter format that is either adorned or interwoven decorative elements.

Fantasie Monogram Standard Styles

Fantasie Monogram is only capable of two letter monograms due to its unique design. For those with Opentype Ligatures enabled, Fantasie Monogram will automatically type the monogram correctly no matter what combination of Capitals and Lowercase you type.

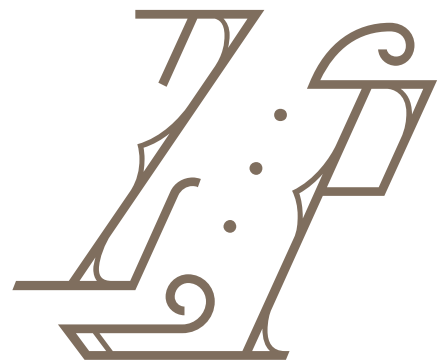
To create a vintage inspired monogram, select MFC Fantasie Monogram from your font menu, and just type a Capital, then a lowercase letter.



Type R then s

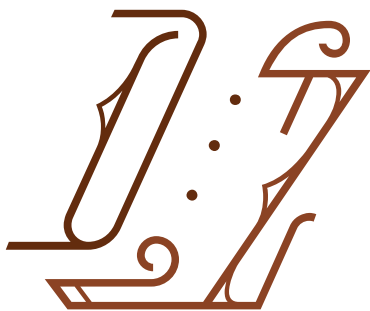


Type H then k



Type Z then p

If you want to add a little style to this straightforward monogram, try playing with tonal colors to create an illusion of fading or contrasting colors for a playful vibe. Set one color for the Capital letter, and a different color for the lowercase letter. (see the examples below)



Type O then z



Type E then j



Type B then y



Type N then g

Turning off the Opentype Ligatures feature altogether enables you to type in a manner not normally intended for Monogram typefaces, by typing in all Capitals for unique titling typesetting options. (typing in all lowercase causes undesirable tail collisions)



Typing with Caps Lock enabled and Opentype Ligatures disabled makes it easy to play with titling options using MFC Fantasie Monogram
