
MFC Almond Monogram Guidebook

The inspiration source for Almond Monogram is a highly unusual warped letterset from a vintage embroidery publication combining to create an almond form monogram. Originally intended to adorn handkerchiefs, it has many other possibilities. Numbers and letters can be combined to create one side of the monogram, while the other side is completed by ornament glyphs under the comma, period, braceleft, braceright, bracketleft and bracketright characters. This is one of many monogram designs from the early 1900's which fall into a two letter format that is either adorned or interwoven with ornamentation.


Almond Monogram Style

Almond Monogram is only capable of two letter or two numeral monograms due to its unique design. Eight ornaments are included to further accentuate and add sophistication to the monogram form.

To create these unique monograms, select MFC Almond Monogram from your font menu, then just type a Capital, then a lowercase letter, followed by a comma, period, braceleft, braceright, bracketleft or bracketright character. For numerals type a Shift-Numeral followed by a Numeral.
